
The college admissions process is more stressful, more confusing and far more complicated than before.

Initial Observations - Class of 2021

- With more students applying test options, colleges were able to move closer to more equitable opportunities for students.
- Early Decision still an important tool
- Test scores were considered
- Virtual Information Sessions and tours beneficial to students in lieu of in-person visits



Lessons for Class of 2022 - and Beyond

- Transcript: Most important!
- Standardized Tests (Florida public colleges); end of Subject Tests
- Timing of application: Early Decision
- Essays
- Resume, including what students did during COVID
- Letters of recommendation
- Legacy & Athletes
- Well-rounded class including broad experiences & background



Context of your School and Environment

Your Child's School vs. Another School:

Colleges look at how your child did in the environment they are in.



Extracurricular Involvement: Academics

- Independent Research- with a company or without
- Math acceleration: EMF, IMACS, Stanford online and many options for computer science
- MOOCs: Coursera, edX, Udemy, Harvard etc.
- Courses offered through colleges: Brown, Georgetown, University of Massachusetts
- Extra coursework for high school credit Broward Virtual, FLVS or similar
- Extra coursework for Dual Enrollment credit through Broward College, UF, FAU, FIU, Embry-Riddle



Extracurricular Involvement: General



- Art, Music, Writing, Theater, Dance
- Speech & Debate, Coding, Robotics, Newspaper, Quiz Bowl, Model UN
- Languages
- Volunteer start something or join an organization

How to Make the College Match

- Online information sessions
- Virtual college fairs
- Connect via social media
- Explore the college's website
- Sit in on a class (usually restricted to 11th and 12th grade)
- Speak with current students and alumni
- School college counselor / independent college counselor

- Seniors-only
 - Institution-based

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Things to Do: Students

- Create an application activity list and add to it over time
- Build vocabulary
- Plan summers wisely
- Expect complications
- Banish self doubt
- Get excited about high school and college



Things to Do: Parents

- Early on, be honest about finances: use the College Net Price Calculator: https://nces.ed.gov
- Apply for Financial Aid (seniors) FAFSA
 - CSS Profile, IDOC or other school-specific requirements
- Get correct information
 - Experts, not friends and family
- Work together
- Expect complications
- Be a calming influence



Tips for A Successful High School to College Journey

- Exposure to diverse experiences
 - Summer, after school, hobbies
- Develop intellectually and emotionally
 - College success is based on academic and maturity
- Be open to intellectual risks
- Treat failures as learning opportunities
- Know that many gifted students may also have learning challenges, important to address both
